

Baseball in Blacktown

Australian Baseball League match Blacktown International Sportspark, on December 8th, 2012





One December evening in Western Sydney, members of the AJS and their families and friends attended Blacktown International Sportspark to watch a match of the Australian Baseball League.

The ABL is Australia's newest answer to the big-time leagues of Japan and the USA, and although the league may be small by comparison, the old ball-game is the same as ever.

This match saw the local favourites and home team the *Sydney* Blue Sox go head to head with the Canberra Cavalry. Admittedly, though, the Cavalry held a special place, at least for the AJS crowd, as their team hosts three Japanese league players, outfielder Koei Shibata, right-handed pitcher Hirokazu Shiranita, and left-handed pitcher Masanori Fujihara, all from

the Hanshin Tigers (pictured, along with keen AJS-NSW spectators Anita Byrnes, Junya Kudo and Thomas O'Keefe). Shibata-san did well at bat, and Fujihara-san came in as relief pitcher for the Cavalry. All three were stationed with the Cavalry up to the end of 2012.

The Japanese contingent in the ABL, scattered across several teams, are wisely taking advantage of the opposing seasons of the two countries. In effect, they enjoy an endless summer, training hard and vigorously for the next Japanese league season back home. It seems to have paid off, because the Japan-infused Canberra Cavalry managed to convincingly defeat the Sydney Blue Sox, with a 6-2 victory. Australia-Japan sporting links like this one are made possible thanks to Cavalry associate Jeff Williams, a native of Canberra, spent much of his career in Japan playing for the Hanshin Tigers, and now acts as a scout for the Japanese team.

These kinds of connections between our two countries may not be heralded as mightily as the next trade pact, however they

help improve communication, understanding and camaraderie at the grassroots level, where personal relationships, the bedrock of any other kind, can grow and strengthen into something very useful.

Those of us present enjoyed the chance to sit directly behind home plate, a spectator position that would cost both arms and both legs in most other parts of the world. The Blacktown facility was built and used for the Sydney 2000 Olympics, which was back in the days when baseball and softball still held a place on the Olympic Games playbill. Getting there is a relatively simple drive out along the M7 or M4, depending on where you are coming from in greater Sydney.
